

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION EGYPT & JORDAN

PASSPORT AND VISA INFORMATION

Your passport needs to be valid for **at least six (6) months** after your journey ends, and should have a minimum of two (2) blank visa pages for entry and exit stamps.

Egypt

A tourist visa is required for U.S. and Canadian passport holders for entry into Egypt.

There are currently three options available as outlined below. A&K recommends U.S. citizens obtain an electronic visa (eVisa).

Of Special Note: Canadian Passport Holders

Canadian passport holders are not eligible to obtain e-Visas or visas on arrival in Egypt and must obtain a visa stamp prior to arrival. E-visas issued for travel beginning October 1, 2023, will not be considered valid for entry into Egypt. Applicants must provide 2 passport photos and a copy of their day-by-day travel itinerary along with their visa application. Processing time is approximately 2-3 weeks. Canadian passport holders who reside in Ontario Province (except Ottawa), Quebec Province (except Gatineau) and the Eastern Provinces and Territories must apply for visas directly by mail or in person at the Consulate General of Egypt in Montreal, Quebec, at the address below. Canadian passport holders residing elsewhere may apply for their visa stamp through our partner VisaCentral visacentral.com/abercrombiekent.

Electronic Visa (eVisa): To apply for an eVisa, visit visa2egypt.gov.eg/eVisa/Home. The current fee for a single-entry visa is USD \$25 (subject to change without notice) and requires a minimum of seven (7) days for processing. Read and follow all instructions carefully to ensure a smooth arrival in Egypt. If the visa application asks you to provide an email address for your host tour operator in Egypt, please use akegypt@abercrombiekent.com.eg. You may also be required to upload documents (e.g. passport photo or copy of your passport information page) to complete the eVisa process. Please be aware that eVisas are valid for 90 days after issuance. Therefore do not apply for your eVisa too far in advance. If you experience technical problems with the eVisa website, try again a few hours later or the following day.

Visa on Arrival: A tourist visa can be obtained on arrival at Cairo International Airport (CAI). The current fee for a single-entry visa is USD \$25 (subject to change without notice) and must be paid in cash in U.S. dollars. *Please be aware that long lines are common.*

Visa Stamp: A visa stamp in your passport can be obtained either by applying directly to an Egyptian consulate or through a visa processing service. While there are additional costs involved in using a visa service, this option is available for guests who prefer assistance in the visa process. Please note that Egyptian consulates will often not accept visa applications submitted more than 30 days prior to your arrival in Egypt, so do not apply for your visa too early.

Jordan

An Electronic Visa (eVisa) is required for U.S. and Canadian passport holders for entry into Jordan.

Electronic Visa (eVisa): To apply for an eVisa, visit the Ministry of Interior website, selecting the Electronic Visa option: <https://eservices.moi.gov.jo>. EVisas are valid for entry to Jordan by air and all land border crossings including entering Jordan from Israel via the Allenby Bridge. The current fee for a single-entry visa is 40 Jordanian dinars (approximately USD \$56); subject to change without notice. If required a double-entry visa may be obtained for 60 Jordanian dinars (approximately USD \$85). Please be aware that eVisas are valid for 90 days after issuance. Therefore, do not apply for your eVisa too far in advance. You will need a valid email address and credit or debit card to apply. Read and follow all instructions carefully to ensure a smooth arrival in Jordan. There is also a 2 Jordanian dinar service fee for standard processing which may take one to two weeks. Once approved, you will receive an email with a QR code, which you will need to present to Jordanian immigration authorities.

Citizens of other countries should contact the appropriate consular office for entry requirements pertaining to their journey.

YELLOW FEVER VACCINATION

A yellow fever vaccination is only required to enter Egypt and Jordan **if** you are arriving from, or have transited through, a yellow fever-endemic area in South America or Africa. The CDC and WHO each provide a current list of all affected countries. If vaccination for yellow fever is necessary, you must carry an International Certificate of Vaccination provided by your physician; you may be denied entry without it. If your physician advises against receiving the vaccination because of your personal medical history, he or she can provide you with the necessary documentation for the country/countries you are visiting.

LOCAL HEALTH & SAFETY PROTOCOLS

A visit to the ancient site of Petra in Jordan is an active excursion involving long walks over uneven terrain, steep climbs and exposure to high temperatures. A robust level of fitness is necessary. A visit to Petra may be challenging for travellers with mobility issues.

CASH & CREDIT CARDS

Egypt: Cash transactions can be made in either U.S. dollars or local currency. Major credit cards are widely accepted for goods and services. Access to ATM machines is widespread in cities and towns, but may be limited in rural areas.

Jordan: Cash transactions should be made in local currency. Major credit cards are widely accepted for goods and services. Access to ATM machines is widespread in cities and towns, but may be limited in rural areas.

OF SPECIAL NOTE:

Early Wake-Up Calls

In order to maximize sightseeing opportunities and avoid the extreme heat of the mid-day hours, most Egypt journeys include several days with very early wake-up calls.

Photography

Please be aware that, due to security restrictions, drones and/or drone cameras are not permitted in Egypt.

PACKING LIST & BAGGAGE RESTRICTIONS

Baggage Restrictions: For checked baggage on **flights between Amman and Cairo**, passengers are allowed two pieces per person with a maximum weight of approximately 50 pounds (23 kilograms) each. The sum of the three dimensions of one piece must not exceed 62 inches (158 centimeters). For carry-on baggage, passengers are allowed one piece per person with a maximum weight of approximately 15 pounds (7 kilograms).

For checked baggage on **flights within Egypt**, passengers are allowed one piece per person with a maximum weight of approximately 33 pounds (15 kilograms). For carry-on baggage, passengers are allowed one piece per person with a maximum weight of approximately 11 pounds (5 kilograms). These limitations are strictly enforced. Excess luggage can be stored at your hotel in Cairo.

Please use the provided A&K luggage tags, even if your bags already have ID tags. This makes it easier for A&K staff to collect and manage your luggage for you.

Clothing

Choose versatile, casual clothing that can be layered if the weather (or level of air-conditioning) requires. Smart casual attire is appropriate for evenings and aboard Nile cruise vessels. Formal clothing is not necessary.

Temples, mosques and other religious sites require conservative dress. Both sexes should cover their arms, legs and shoulders (women should pack a scarf for this purpose.) Wear or carry a pair of socks when sightseeing, since shoes must be removed when visiting certain religious sites.

- Casual slacks
- Walking shorts
- Polo shirts, casual short-sleeve shirts or blouses
- Long sleeve shirts or blouses
- Long comfortable skirts for women
- Scarf large enough to cover neck and shoulders for women
- Sweater or lightweight jacket
- Comfortable walking shoes with traction
- Brimmed hat for sun protection
- Foldable umbrella to use as sun shade
- Sleepwear
- Personal garments
- Socks
- Swimwear/cover-up

Other Recommended Items

- Face masks and hand sanitizer
- Sun block / Insect repellent
- Sunglasses
- Prescriptions and medications (in their original bottles and/or packaging)
- Simple first-aid kit
- Smartphone
- Extra eyeglasses/contact lenses
- Global travel adapter
- Charging cables for electronics

Optional Items

- Small LED flashlight
- Foldable walking stick

- Small daypack or fanny pack

Note: We recommend that guests do not bring binoculars when travelling to Egypt and Jordan. There have been reports of binoculars being confiscated upon arrival, resulting in delays at the airport or border crossings.

Laundry service is available at most hotels and aboard Nile cruise vessels. Dry cleaning is available in larger cities. Check costs and return times before using these services.

TIPPING GUIDELINES

While decisions regarding tipping rest entirely with you, we suggest the following gratuities (noted in U.S. dollars) depending on the type of journey.

For extra nights or Tailor Made services added to a Small Group Journey, please follow the Tailor Made Journeys guidelines for these days only.

Please Note: In both **Egypt** and **Jordan** it is extremely common to encounter restroom attendants in airports, bazaars, and other sites frequented by tourists. While not compulsory, it is customary to tip these individuals an amount in local currency equal to approximately .25 to .50 cents.
